MANHATTAN -- The Kansas State University department of music will offer many musical events throughout November.

All events, except where noted, are free and open to the public. They include:

- German guest artist Martin Munch will present a piano recital at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 3, in All Faiths Chapel. Munch will perform works by Maurice Ravel and two sonatas by Alexander Scriabin, as well as his own compositions. Munch comes to Kansas from Heidelberg, Germany, where he teaches piano performance at the University of Bamberg.

- The K-State Clarinet Choir, directed by Tod Kerstetter, associate professor of clarinet, and the K-State Tuba/Euphonium Ensemble, directed by Steven Maxwell, assistant professor of tuba and euphonium, will share a recital at 7:30 p.m.

Wednesday, Nov. 4, in All Faiths Chapel. The Clarinet Ensemble will present the premiere performance of a new arrangement of the second movement of Ralph Vaughan Williams' "Tuba Concerto," arranged for solo tuba and clarinet ensemble by Kerstetter. Maxwell will be the tuba soloist.

- Anna Marie Wytko's saxophone students will perform a recital at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 5, in All Faiths Chapel.

- "Sticks and Strings," the semiannual performance featuring chamber music performances by student string ensembles and student keyboard percussion groups, will be at 7:30 p.m.

Wednesday, Nov. 11, in All Faiths Chapel. String groups will present works by Shostakovich, Mozart and William Grant Still.

- Students from the voice, keyboard, string, wind and percussion divisions will perform a General Student Recital at 11:30 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 12, in All Faiths Chapel.

- The "Early Music Festival" will start at 5:45 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 19, in All Faiths Chapel. The concert will feature music history students of Nora Lewis, assistant professor of oboe, and the Collegium Musicum, directed by Thomas Bell, assistant professor and performing arts librarian. The event will introduce a variety of musical topics.
